Hello, everyone, and welcome to our Live Without Limbs monthly livestream. And I just want you to know that each month we try and have me speak about a topic that's not just relevant. but applicable. in our daily lives in the spiritual aspect of going through life's ups and downs and trying to understand that God is the one that we need to hold on to, as he will always carry us when we can't even feel like we can walk on our own.

I just want you to know out there, I love you. I know the world seems a little crazy right now. And welcome to the livestream, if this is your first time, and at the very end, we'll actually be having a live Q&A session. So, make sure you stick around until the very end so you can submit your questions as well in that chat box there below. I just want to first of all, before we do anything, open up in prayer, as we always do here. Let's pray.

"Father God, we come before You and we thank You so much for tonight. We thank You that You love us. We thank You more than You also know what we feel. Lord, we thank You, Jesus, for dying on the cross for our sins, and showing us that You were more than human as You conquered death and sin itself. Yeah, Lord, while You are both God and man in flesh. We thank You that in that You showed us that You do know how it feels to be rejected. And all types of other pain, including hatred, tonight that we're going to be talking about. Father, we thank You that we do have the Word, the Bible, to help us in our life, as we continue to know You more, and try and have our life fulfilled in our spiritual realm, in our relationships, and in the purpose that You've designed for a greater purpose here on earth for our lives. And we thank You, God that You would comfort us. You know, Lord, our pain, our desires and our needs. We ask God, You would help us all tonight, as we talk tonight about Your kindness, and Lord, your strength in times of weakness. Nn Jesus and we pray—and all God's people said, Amen."

Well, I just want to say that in the obviously, first of all, I'm going to tell you the title a little bit. I mentioned that in the prayer. You know, we've titled this as "Haters." And as the ancient haters and American haters. And when you experience hate in your life, whether it's people putting you down, verbally face to face, I think with social media platforms, it's almost as if though we've gone into a hypersensitivity and exposure with, if you will divisible lines of disagreement that sparks and feels hatred towards one another as people things that they say, and that you don't agree with, or things that you say and do that people hate you for.

And I don't know, but I think that it's even more exasperated on social media, because it feels like you can kind of hide behind a screen. And that ability maybe even gives people this sense of more of a liberty to just tell you publicly how much they hate you and talking about you, not behind your back, but publicly. And then when other people see that, and people you know spewing their guts and hate you too, one towards one another, I tell you, it just breeds more hate, right?

Fighting fire with fire creates more fire. I mean, you look at the world, from social issues, to political issues, things that are moral issues that are framed as political issues and religious differences in there and we can't talk about anything. It seems that conversations these days can become quickly heated, doesn't it? And the truth is, is that hate has never brought any positive change. Can we agree on that?

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And quite frankly, it never will. You see hate only strengthens people's convictions for or against an issue and it leads to further conflict, as history shows us can even lead to war.

Guys, love is the only force that can bring positive change. Can I say that again, love is the only force that can bring positive change. And before we talk about the absolute truth of the Bible, and how we know as Christians serving the God who is love who loves us unconditionally, the sentence herein is kindness always wins, and by the mercy of God, we want to open up now in some references, and even scriptures I'd like to read tonight about Jesus, and what He tells us about when we experience hatred in our life.

First of all, in Matthew 5:44, Jesus said, "But I tell you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you. Can I just say this for a second, I am so thankful for many people around me who have literally as they've prayed to God out loud, I've learned how to pray in ways that I have been exposed to for the first time. I then heard my Uncle Batta publicly pray in front of other people saying the same thing I've heard him say before, but they they're hearing it for the first time. And I'll never forget how beautifully eloquently and righteously and humbly my Uncle Batta have prayed a line he frequently says, "and bless our enemies. Bless them in a way who may have ill intent against us, to open up God, this scales of their eyes, that they may see the truth and be convicted of the evil that they don't see. And to also stop they're evil and even repent of their sins, to find the forgiveness of God for their own souls for this soul's sake."

Yet in the same breath, God bind our enemy's deeds. I love that he first prays for the salvation of the enemy. Not every religion, prays for their enemy. In fact, quite the contrary. And actually, we can have so much assurance that it's not the hatred that comes from the people that we need to worry about as people as such. But it's the powers and principalities of darkness, that are not God that are not light and salt of the earth that are used by the enemy, to prick us, poke us in the eye and kick us at times, to stir us up in a way to sin in reaction. It's not just about though reacting in how to be just and righteous and loving, but also to understand that when people hate you, first of all, Jesus knows how it is to be hated.

First of all, talk about the hatred that He went through. Go read it, go read it in the Gospels in the New Testament. We know that when we live for Jesus Christ, as Jesus was hated, we will also be hated as well. And I want you to know that in that we have confidence in knowing that when we ask God for comfort for our own self and spiritual balance and healing, that in that same breath, it's understanding that we can forgive those who hurt us who persecute us, because we have found forgiveness through Jesus Christ, especially when we stand up for truth, based on the Bible, and especially when you look at our own family and friends that have been greatly persecuted for their faith in various countries, as they share Jesus Christ, it being an illegal act, either holding the Bible in their hand, or preaching the gospel.

The wonderful friend and brother in Christ, Joseph Bondarenko from the Good Call Ministries, he lives by this verse, Romans 1:16, "For I am (this Apostle Paul saying), "I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ. It is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes." Joseph Bondarenko was arrested decades ago for being the evangelists that he was asked by the KGB. He's the author of *KGB's Most Wanted*, who actually did never stop preaching the Gospel who knew what would happen if it continued and he continued to preach a Gospel in spite of being handcuffed, arrested and detained by the KGB

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tortured in chambers, where you could not stand for months and months and months. It's a miracle with the magnitude of torture that Joseph Bondarenko went through and still is alive. That in itself is a miracle. He's still alive. He lives in America, sought asylum here with his four daughters and one brother. He's got four daughters and one son, who are all married and they have grandkids. And now the Good Call Ministries is to go out and tell people to not be surprised when evil people do evil things, and to get ready to sacrifice whatever we need to sacrifice for the cause and the sake of Jesus Christ, and even says, "Rejoice when they persecute you on behalf of meaning from my namesake, for great is your reward in heaven."

And I tell you, when I give Joseph Bondarenko a hug, I tell you, I'm hugging one of the legends as we human beings and say, a legend of the faith, who went all the way. And I want you to know that Joseph Bondarenko's book will change your life. Please look it up at the Good Call Ministries. I also want to open up apart from a friend family persecution story that I wanted to relate to you in the 21st century, if you will, who's still alive. And we know many others who are persecuted. We know what's happening in Afghanistan. We know what's happening in the Middle East. We know what's been happening around the world and we pray for those who are persecuted. Amen. And we be the hands and feet where we can.

Secondly, a want to relate Luke 23 into this where there is the story of the arrest and the death sentence of Jesus Christ on a cross. Obviously, if you know the story, I'm not going to repeat a lot of it. But here are some points I wanted to bring to you tonight. It ends with the most incredible act of undeserved kindness, mercy and love. Barabbas was a well-known criminal insurrectionist and murderer. He was hated by the Jews. But there was one other person that was also hated. And more. His name was Jesus. He was accused of blasphemy saying that He was God, according to scriptures in the New Testament, that He is who they say He was saying that I am. "I am, the I Am."

And there was a tradition that once through a year the Roman governor of Israel would release one criminal act, the request of the Jewish people and the leaders and it was asked at the crowd of Jesus sentencing, "Do you want me to release Jesus?" but the crowd shouted back, "Give us Barabbas!" And when the governor asked what they wanted him to do with Jesus, the crowd yelled, "Crucify Him, want to read it?

Luke 23:23 but they were insistent, demanding with loud voices that He be crucified. Now look, it's all of our sins that put Jesus on the cross. It's not about the hatred of a people at the time. I want you to know that the any other film about the crucifixion of Christ, what films have been shared out there about the crucifixion, has nothing to do in particular with the Jews hating Jesus as a people. In fact, many, many times through the Torah and the New Testament, affirmed and echoed are God's people understood that, that God loved and love everyone, and it's not about who were the ones that pierced the hands of Jesus as much as whose sin the world said put those nails through the hands of Jesus. People say well, I never did that. I never asked someone to sacrifice their son for my sins?

No, the bottom line is God knew that He was holy, and we would not after the fall of Adam and Eve's sin, and I just want to preface this because it's really, really important for you to understand the Gospel of Jesus. Jesus was God in the flesh, and He could have sent all the angels down. He could have

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gotten off that cross with the power of Him being God in the flesh, but He chose to die for you and me. He chose to take that sin and the wages of sin being death, the atonement of sin was death, the sacrificial lamb of God, meaning in the Torah, the Jewish people would sacrifice and use the blood of the animals for the atonement of sin.

"For God then so loved the world that He gave His only Son that whosoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life." What does that mean? That we didn't have to, now for the sins of our land, do offerings of sacrifice of blood of animals on the altar, but Jesus died once and for all. And if we believe that Jesus died for our sins, then we don't die for ours if we know that the penalty of our sins, death, was paid in our place.

All right. Now, let's do this again. Luke 23:23, "But they were insistent, demanding with loud voices that he be crucified, and the voices of these men and of the chief priests prevailed."

Next verse: "So Pilate gave sentence that it should be as they requested, and he released to them the one they requested, who for rebellion and murder had been thrown into prison, but he delivered Jesus to their will."

Well, we know that Jesus was innocent, meaning He did not deserve a crucifixion, yet he stayed silent. Jesus was pure. He was pure in love. He is purely love. Barabbas was pure evil. Yet, Jesus did not argue with this exchange. Now, get this because I don't know if you've ever put this together even if you know the story. But this is powerful. You see, in a way Barabbas represents all of us. Jesus really exchanged His life with the life of Barabbas in the same way that Jesus exchanged His life for you and me.

"He who knew no sin, became sin so that we could be the righteousness of God." Jesus showed incredible, courageous kindness to Barabbas. He showed us the pattern, that kindness and love always wins. In a world that wants to spew hate, my friends, God shows us the better way is to spread love. It's to forgive our enemies. If we truly see that we are forgiven of our sins, then who are we to not forgive those who sin against us? Are we higher than God?

You see, that's when in Matthew it says if you don't forgive your enemies, you can't come to heaven. Again, it's not a deed that you have to procure to gain heaven and earn Heaven, because none of us can. It's the understanding of the invitation of the pure love of Jesus Christ, for I have sinned many times, and I daily die to myself and I daily asking a personal relationship with God, to forgive me on my sin because Nick fails God every single day. I pray for forgiveness. I speak to Jesus directly. He is my priest. And he knows my prayer even before I say it. He knew my name before the earth began. And He received me as He receives you with open arms. Well, what if I say the F word I need to stop saying the F word, I need to stop this—I have this addiction, I have that. He says, "Come as you are all who are weary and burdened and heavy laden and I will give you rest."

Are you looking for rest, my friend? Are you just, right now, so distracted and hijacked by emotions of hatred in your life? You know, some of you actually hate you for you. You can't even forgive yourself of what you've done. You can't seem to replenish your memory of these things. True healing can only

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come from true forgiveness from the only true forgiving God, because of the true sacrifice, Jesus Christ. And if you've never received this exchange (your old life for a new life in Jesus Christ), I want to let you know that this opportunity is for you. He wants you to have eternal life. He took the punishment you should have received, just like He took the punishment that Barabbas should have received.

And tonight, if you want to say a prayer that begins your active relationship with Jesus Christ, let's pray. Say, "Dear God, I come before you. And I thank you for your love. Thank you, God, that You have a plan for me. In full my life. Forgive me of all of my sins. I am so sorry for everything I've done. I don't want my plan anymore. I want Your plan. I don't want my strength. I need Your strength. God, forgive me and come into my life. Fill me with your Holy Spirit that I may sense your presence, Your joy, Your peace and healing. God give me faith. Teach me how to pray. Show me how to read my Bible. and get to know you each and every day. Thank you, God, that You'll never leave me. And You'll always be with me. I want to know You. I don't want to sit. I want to know You and live for You. Thank You, Lord. In Jesus name, I pray. Amen."

Friend, if you prayed that prayer with me, let me know that you say YES to Jesus. And that you did say that prayer, wanting to start your faith journey with Jesus Christ. We've got a question from Wendy. "What is the title of the book that this Joseph that you talked about?"

Oh, yes. It's called *KGB's Most Wanted*. Joseph Bondarenko's book is called *KGB's Most Wanted*. You can find it on the <u>goodcallministries.org/</u>

They are dear friends of mine, in fact, so much so have a legend of faith that in 2017, when Life Without Limbs was invited to speak in front of hundreds of thousands of people publicly, they reported 400,000 people. We counted with our fingers that it was closer to 800,000. And about half of them gave their life

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to Jesus right there and then. And before I got up there to speak to a live audience of 53 million people watching in several countries in the region on livestream TV in September 2017, I kindly asked the organizers if they would allow Joseph Bondarenko to speak to his people. And it happened to be that he was only one mile from that stage, the stage where he was preaching from—sorry—was only one mile away from where the KGB arrested him first. That's a miracle.

And so yes, please, please read that because I feel like Western society is different than those of us in our culture, like my Slavic background, descended in Yugoslavia, who was in a country that was divided many, many times. I think that most Americans who are not in a coma, not asleep and under coma, don't understand how quickly not only can hatred and division from the enemy, separate us culturally, but even bring it [hatred] to a point of violence and persecution. And I just want you to know that I love you, and that book will help build up your faith. If God forbid, you ever come into a position where you're a persecuted Christian yourself.

We have a question now from Flung—Flung A., I'm not sure. "How to prepare. How do we prepare on not to forgive even when you are still hurting?"

I love that question. Can I tell you something I don't normally share much. In 2007, someone hurt me so, so deeply. And it took me 10 years to actually forgive. And I'm the evangelist, right? I, the evangelist, should not have taken 10 years to forgive someone, but when you are hurting, and you understand, not only should we forgive, because God says and we should be quick to forgive, we should "be slow to anger and quick to listen," and then pray for those enemies. It took me a while to even want to even think of even thinking of doing it one day. And so, I think we're all in the same boat when it comes to being hurt and not really wanting or desiring to forgive. And that's when I started praying, "God, I know I need to forgive them because I also know that they probably don't even know that I have unforgiveness against them still."

And it doesn't even matter whether they're sorry, or not, even if they did know. Because when I say, "I forgive you," I am the one who is released. Someone who doesn't even believe they've done evil against you, they're not the one released. It's you're the one being released.

Now, if you're in an abusive domestic violence, human trafficked, situation of oppression and false addiction, domestic violence in your home, that is not God's best for you. And please reach out to a local church, who might help you to counsel through that. Or you can connect with our Groundwire Team to maybe know how to reach out to somebody properly. And we are not counselors here, but we are friends who want to make sure that you understand that, yes, we are to forgive about enemies, but being trapped in something like that is not God's ideal plan whatsoever for you. And He allows sometimes the enemy to allow evil in our life beyond our understanding. So, when I say forgiving your enemy doesn't mean though, that you just sit there and stay there, especially if you need counseling and urgent help. So please reach out.

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But yes, I started praying to God saying, "God, I know I don't feel like forgiving them. So help me to stop feeling to forgive them and want to forgive them." And I just came to a point, it was actually Thanksgiving—I'll never forget it—it was Thanksgiving in 2017, it was six months after my dad was buried from cancer. And I just knew, "Hey, I don't need to carry that anymore!"

And so, ask God to help you through that. And, you know, maybe even look for books. I mean, look at Joseph Bondarenko. That's a great book. And he talks about forgiveness in there as well and the miracles therein, that when you not just read the Bible, but other inspiring stories about how God use others, to be the salt and light and be the hands and feet of God, and examples of faith and righteousness, that builds up your faith as well. So, I hope that helps you.

I also have a book at LifeWithoutLimbs org, where I get really transparent about this. It's actually chapter three of the book of *Unstoppable*. If you look at that book, (excuse me) at LifeWithoutLimbs org, and you go to the shopping cart there, 100% goes back to our ministry at LifeWithoutLimbs org. Me surfing on a surfboard—that's the front cover. So it's much my favorite book that I've written so far. I love it. So, I talk about that day.

There's a lot of people out there who could do with more hands and feet have God.

So, if you feel stuck there, then the only way to get unstuck, is to go out there and do more. And then the other excuse would be, "Well, I don't have time. And when can I do it?"

Well, we in our own family periodically go out to go feed the homeless. And actually, my son loves to take his own money to go buy some food from the grocery stores to go give it to them themselves through a distribution program, SOUL churches, the one that we work with here in Dallas. And we love that. So, it's a balance of spending time with God, knowing that He loves you, not for what you do, but because You're His.

But then at the same time when you know the love of Jesus Christ, all you want to do is go help other people know about the love of Jesus Christ as well. So go out there and keep on going until you get

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tired, and when you get tired, rejoice because it's awesome to go out there, and go in the Lord's field and help people know that Jesus loves them.

Preach the Gospel. Sometimes use words. I use a lot of words. I use the J word, the G word. And the cross word, the C word, cross, right? It's all about Jesus and love and the cross. And I can't stop talking about it. Love you.
